


### Science

It has been a very busy term. Year 7 have been learning all about rocks and how the Earth moves through space. They have been having lots of fun understanding how the tilt of the Earth as it spins causes the Seasons and how the position of the Earth, Sun and the Moon results in the phases of the moon. Mrs. Charif's class used Oreo biscuits to make a model of the phases of the moon.

Year 8 completed a Force topic and did some balloon surfing to demonstrate our interactions with different forces. They have also completed a topic on Ecosystems learning about the importance of balance in nature and adaptations organisms must allow them to survive in an environment.

Year 9 have been working hard on their Depth Study booklets. The booklet allows them to improve their working scientifically skills. These Skills are needed for them to complete their first assessment task in year 10 where they complete an experiment to test a hypothesis and write a report on their findings.

Year 8 and 9 students were involved in the Universal Robotics Challenge, which was sponsored by EduTech Australian and the NSW Government. They competed in the Australian Finals on Friday the 1<sup>st</sup> of December at Homebush.





The students worked in groups to build and code a robot to navigate a course, picking up a package and delivering it to another location in the course. Thank you to Dr Wallis and Mr. Baxter who mentored the students throughout this journey.

Students using multiplication and division grouping strategies like 'double counting' - this means they can keep track of multiple sequences at the same time as keeping track of the number of groups, without relying on material or markers to represent the groups.' Students really enjoyed a hand-on approach to learning! This activity was followed up with reflection questions.




