






Year 11 Business Studies

Year 10 STEM students and Year 11 Engineering Studies students from Auburn Girls High School had the privilege of attending one such event, 'Engineering your Future' at the Powerhouse Museum on the 7th of March 2023, conducted by Engineers Australia and notable universities across the state.

Our busy day consisted of three engaging workshops; building the tallest structure challenge, hosted by UNSW, building a model dam, hosted by Western Sydney University and VR mining, hosted by University of Wollongong. MathsOnline - Every student studying Mathematics have full and free access to MathsOnline. This is a platform where students can learn Mathematics at their own pace and complete course work relevant to what they are studying in class.



Students can use this platform to catch up on content missed, use it to move ahead or study for an upcoming assessment task.



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Careers/Secondary Studies

Students from the class of 2022 achieved some outstanding results, with 62% of the cohort achieving a Band 4 (a mark of 70) or above in HSC. Seven of our wonderful girls gained an ATAR above 90, with a top ATAR of 98.5! This puts these girls in the top 10% of the state and is worthy of much celebration.

When compared with the state, 13 of our courses performed above the state average. Our heartfelt gratitude goes to all our hard-working teachers who ensured students reached their maximum potential in their final year of secondary education.




In addition, 86 students (all of our ATAR cohort) gained over 500 offers to university – many of them receiving multiple offers prior to HSC exams based on their Year 11 results, Leadership and Community involvement, or on School Recommendation. This allowed students to focus on their exams without the added stress associated with university entry. All universities have agreed to continue early offers in 2023, but these will not be released until after HSC Trial exams have been completed.

For our 2023 Year 12 cohort, lunchtime information sessions have already begun to help provide guidance around UAC applications, how to receive early offers and scholarships, apply for specific adjustment factors, as well as how to determine the best university options for various courses. A schedule of these sessions is posted outside the Careers office. In addition, a new YR 12 UAC Google Class has been created as a one-stop shop for all university information. If your daughter is currently on an ATAR pathway and is in Year 12, please check they have joined the class online.

UAC applications will open next term, and students will have until the end of Term 3 to complete the application process. Changes to preferences can be made throughout Term 4 and in to early 2024, once students know what offers they already have and what their final results are.

We look forward to supporting this year's HSC cohort to ensure they successfully transition into the next phase of their further education and training.

Sarah Chaudhary received the Year 10 2022 USYD Academic Achievement award at a ceremony in the Great Hall at the University of Sydney last week.




Library
