Dear Parents, Carers and Students,

With our return to face-to-face learning, our Staff worked incredibly hard to prepare and ensure the school was safe and ready for our students to return. I would like to thank our amazing team of teachers and administrative staff who have worked to ensure a seamless transition back to school. A huge thank you to our Deputy Principals, Ms Diamond, Ms Minogue and Ms Kaidbay for their work with their year groups and Ms Garvey, HT Administration who manages daily operations. Our Year Advisors have also been an amazing support for students, thank you. As you know, during November, our school experienced two incidences where we have been nonoperational due to being notified by the NSW Department of Health and the Department of Education of positive student covid cases. I must thank our parents, students and community for their patience and support while we have worked with the Department to undertake all the necessary contact tracing, communication and cleaning measures required to make our school safe for everyone's return. Contact tracing and communication is a huge but necessary job during nonoperational incidences. A huge thank you must go to Mrs Yavuzcehre, our Senior Administration Manager and her dedicated team of Administration staff as well as our Deputy Principals Ms Diamond, Ms Minogue and Ms Kaidbay as well as Ms Garvey, HT Administration for their work.

Please know that the messages and communication you receive from me or the school regarding nonoperation issues are sent to you immediately as they are forwarded to me.



MAKING ONLINE PAYMENTS

It is now possible for parents to make online payments to the school for amounts owing for students, via a secure payment page hosted by Westpac. Payments can be made using either a Visa, MasterCard, Credit or Debit card, and can be made via computer, tablet or mobile phone. The payment page is accessed from the front page of the schools website by selecting:

"MAKE A PAYMENT" from the taskbar at the top of the page, right hand side.

Items that can be paid include voluntary school contributions, subject contributions, excursions, sales to students and creative and practical arts activities (these include band, drama and dance). There is also a category called 'Other' this to cover items not covered in the previous headings. 'Other' can be used to make a complete payment of a school invoice.

These details are entered each time you make a payment as student information is not held within the payment system.

There is also the option to enter the Student Registration Number and Invoice number if you are aware of them, these are optional fields **OR** there is also the option to enter the Student Registration Number and Invoice number these are not used at our school, please leave blank.

This is a secure payment system hosted by Westpac to ensure that your Credit/Debit card details are captured in a secure manner, these details are not passed back to the school.

For any enquiries regarding the Online Payment process please contact the School Administration Office.

When you access the <u>"\$ Make a payment"</u> you must enter:

- the students name, and class and reference number OR
- the students name, and date of birth
